Boxer Welfare Scotland was founded in January 2005 and we received our charity status as a boxer rescue on 3rd July 2005.

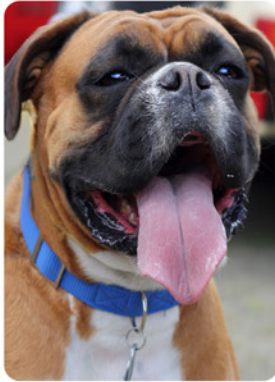

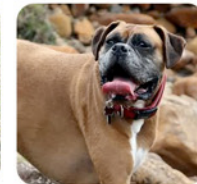
