Boxer Welfare Scotland was founded in January 2005 and we received our charity status as a boxer rescue not long afterwards. Since then we have rescued and rehomed around 380 boxers through our adoption processes.

Boxer Welfare Scotland also hopes to promote responsible dog ownership and, through training, help reduce the number of unwanted dogs. All our rehomed dogs have time spent with them and are assessed by our volunteers before adoption.

Our founder, Lorraine Cumming, the other Trustees and their dedicated team of volunteers commit a lot of their time, energy and love to helping rescue boxers in need across Scotland. Our volunteers are currently based in five main locations; Peterhead, Glasgow, Edinburgh, Falkirk and Moray. Our adoption and rescue policies help us ensure that all our rehomed boxers are safe, secure and well loved.

Rescue boxers deserve just as much love and attention as the cute puppy advertised in your local paper. Adopting a rescue boxer gives hope to a lost soul and breathes life back into a sad heart.

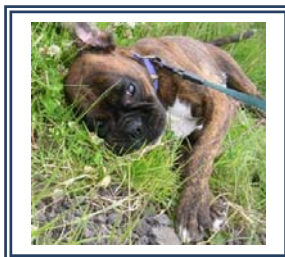
A rescued boxer truly is a grateful friend and loving companion for life.
